

Note 1: A Financial Performance Certificate is required to enter into a new borrowing agreement with the FNFA. To remain in good standing with the FNFA, a Financial Management System Certificate must be obtained within 36 months from when the first nation receives proceeds for the first time from a debenture or equivalent financial instrument issued by the First Nations Finance Authority under the terms of a Borrowing Law and a Security Issuing Council Resolution.

BACKGROUND CONTEXT

The First Nations Fiscal Management Act ("the Act") establishes several first nationFirst Nation institutions – the First Nations Tax Commission ("the FNTC"), the First Nations Financial Management Board and the First Nations Finance Authority ("the FNFA") - with mandates designed to permit first nationsFirst Nations access to financial markets on a similar basis as municipalities and local governments in Canada.

Working in a collaborative framework these three institutions facilitate the voluntary development of first nationFirst Nation capacity to access these markets – by assisting them to use their available revenue streams to secure funding; by assisting them to implement a sound financial management system in which investors and other stakeholders would have confidence; by negotiating on their collective behalf the borrowing of funds from these financial markets.

In order for a first nation in to access these markets through this legislative program, the first nation is eligible to be considered for membership in the FNFA, the FMB must issue a certificate to the first nation indicating that it meets the standards set by the FMB under the Act. For these purposes the FMB has issued the *Financial Performance Standards* for purposes of issuing a first nation indication a Financial Performance Certificate. This certificate supports a first nation's indication application to become a borrowing member of the FNFA and its first financing from the FNFA.

The <u>first_nationFirst Nation</u> must obtain a Financial Management System Certificate from FMB within 36 months after the <u>first_nationFirst_Nation</u> receives proceeds for the first time from a debenture (or equivalent instrument) issued by the FNFA or before it may obtain a second loan from the FNFA. For these purposes the FMB has issued the *Financial Management System Standards* for purposes of issuing a <u>first_nationFirst_Nation</u> a Financial Management System Certificate.

The FMB has also issued the *Financial Management System Certification Procedures* and the *Financial Performance Certification Procedures* to guide <u>first nationsFirst Nations</u> who are applying for a certificate from the FMB. At the beginning of these Procedures is a flowchart that also explains the steps to be taken in this process towards certification.

A first nationFirst Nation will not be issued a Financial Management System Certificate or a Financial Performance Certificate by the FMB unless the first nation's First Nation's law or laws respecting financial administration have first been reviewed and issued a compliance approval by the FMB. The first nation's First Nation's law or laws must meet the requirements of the Financial Administration Law Standards before they will be issued a compliance approval. The FMB has issued the Financial Administration Law Review Procedures to guide first nations First Nations who are applying for compliance approval of their law or laws respecting financial administration. It may be necessary for a first nation First Nation to bring its already approved law or laws respecting financial administration up to date to meet the current Financial Administration Law Standards before it will be issued a Financial Management System Certificate. This may be necessary if there has been some significant period of time between the FMB's approval of the first

nation's First Nation's financial administration law and its request for a Financial Management System Certificate.

To assist <u>first nations</u> First <u>Nations</u>, the FMB has prepared and made available to <u>first nations</u> First <u>Nations</u> a Sample Financial Administration Law (Sample Law) which meets the requirements of the *Financial Administration Law Standards* and which reflects sound financial administration practices of local, provincial and federal government in Canada. There are two versions of this Sample Law available – one meets the standards required to be met by <u>first nationsFirst Nations</u> already raising or intending to raise local revenues under the Act and one meets the standards required to be met by <u>first nationsFirst Nations</u> that are not raising and intending to raise local revenues under the Act.

The FMB's Standards were established through a rigorous research and consultative review process that involved internal review and input and advice from professionals experienced in first-nationFirst-Nation advisory services.

The FMB has carried out case studies of the potential requirements of the standards and procedures with several representative <u>first nationsFirst Nations</u>, to test document and system content and application. The FNTC and FNFA have reviewed and provided comment on the FMB standards, procedures and sample laws to ensure they do not conflict with FNTC and FNFA authorities applicable to scheduled <u>first nationsFirst Nations</u> including FNFA borrowing members.

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FIRST NATIONS FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT BOARD FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE CERTIFICATION PROCEDURES

1.0 AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH PROCEDURES

- **1.1 Act authority** Procedures respecting the certification of a <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial performance under <u>section subsection</u> 50(3) of the *First Nations Fiscal Management Act* are established by the <u>BoardFMB</u> under <u>section subsection</u> 55(2) of the Act.
- **1.2 Procedure revisions** Procedures established by the <u>BoardFMB</u> may be amended or revised from time to time by the <u>BoardFMB</u>.
- **1.3 Access to procedures** BoardFMB procedures in effect from time to time are available from the BoardFMB or may be accessed on the Board'sFMB's web site (www.fnfmb.com).

2.0 PURPOSE OF PROCEDURES

- 2.1 Purpose The purpose of these procedures is to establish a process for the BoardFMB
 - a. to provide assistance to <u>first nations First Nations</u> in the evaluation of their financial performance.
 - b. to formally review a <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial performance on request of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> under the *First Nations Fiscal Management Act* or its regulations,
 - c. to provide a report to the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> setting out the scope of the review undertaken and an opinion to the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> as to whether the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> was in compliance with the *Financial Performance Standards* or as to which aspects of these Standards were not complied with by the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u>, and
 - d. to issue a Financial Performance Certificate under <u>sectionsubsection</u> 50(3) of the Act to the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> if its financial performance is in compliance with the *Financial Performance Standards*.

3.0 APPLICATION OF THESE PROCEDURES

- **3.1 Application** These procedures apply where a <u>first_nationFirst_Nation</u> is requesting the <u>BoardFMB</u> to issue the <u>first_nationFirst_Nation</u> a certificate stating that it was in compliance with the *Financial Performance Standards*.
- **3.2 Waiver** The BoardFMB may, in accordance with its policies, waive any requirement of these procedures as they relate to a particular first nation if the BoardFMB is satisfied it has

sufficient and credible information upon which to base its review of the first nation's First Nation's financial performance.

4.0 INTERPRETATION

4.1 Definitions – Unless the context indicates otherwise, in these procedures:

"Act" means the First Nations Fiscal Management Act,

"Board" means the First Nations Financial Management Board;

"Financial Performance Standards" means the Financial Performance Standards established by the BoardFMB under section subsection 55(1) of the Act;

"Financial Management System Certificate" means a Financial Management System Certificate issued by the BoardFMB under sectionsubsection 50(3) of the Act;

"Financial Management System Standards" means the Financial Management System Standards established by the BoardFMB under sectionsubsection 55(1) of the Act;

"FMB" means the First Nations Financial Management Board;

"reviewer" means the person appointed by the **BoardFMB** under section 7.1 of these procedures.

4.2 Interpretation – In these procedures, a reference to a determination that a <u>first nationFirst</u> <u>Nation</u> was in compliance with the *Financial Performance Standards* means a determination that

the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> was in compliance with the Standards, in all material respects, on the effective date of the review.

5.0 REQUEST FOR ASSISTANCE

- **5.1 Letter of cooperation** A <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> may initiate a client relationship with the <u>BoardFMB</u> by delivering to the <u>BoardFMB</u> a letter of cooperation in the form and with the terms required by the <u>BoardFMB</u>.
- **5.2 Written request for assistance** A <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> may, by resolution of the council of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u>, authorize a named official to make a written request to the <u>BoardFMB</u> for assistance in the review of its financial performance.
- **5.3 Nature of assistance** The **BoardFMB** will determine, in its sole discretion, the nature of any assistance it provides to a **first nation** under this section including, but not limited to, conducting an informal review of its financial performance.
- **5.4 Template forms** The recommended template forms of resolution and letter of cooperation referred to in sections 5.1 and 5.2 are on the Board's FMB's internet website (www.fnfmb.com).

6.0 REQUEST FOR FORMAL REVIEW OF PERFORMANCE

- **6.1 Request for formal review** A <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> may make a written request to the <u>BoardFMB</u>
 - a. to conduct a formal review of the <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial performance to determine whether, in the <u>Board's FMB's</u> opinion, the <u>first nation First Nation</u> was in compliance with the *Financial Performance Standards*, and
 - b. to request the **BoardFMB** to issue the **first nation** a Financial Performance Certificate under **section** 50(3) of the Act.
- **6.2 Required resolution** The request of a <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> under section 6.1 must be accompanied by a resolution of council of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> containing the following:
 - a. a direction and authorization to a named <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> official, on behalf of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u>, to do the following:
 - to seek the informal assistance of the BoardFMB as available and appropriate in order to receive a Financial Performance Certificate from the BoardFMB;
 - ii. to request the BoardFMB to conduct a formal review of the first nation's First Nation's financial performance to determine if the first nationFirst Nation is, at the time of the review, in compliance with the Board's FMB's Financial Performance Standards and to issue a Financial

- Performance Certificate to the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> under <u>sectionsubsection</u> 50(3) of the Act;
- iii. to communicate with and provide all requested documents and information to the person authorized by the <u>BoardFMB</u> to conduct the review of the <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial performance on behalf of the <u>BoardFMB</u> ("the reviewer") as required under these procedures;
- iv. to disclose to the reviewer any events subsequent to the date of the last audited annual financial statements of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> that would materially impact any information provided by or on behalf of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> for purposes of the review of the <u>first nation'sFirst Nation's</u> financial performance or to confirm to the reviewer that there are no subsequent events, as the case may be; and
- v. to verify and confirm that any normalization adjustment described in Standard 8.0 of the *Financial Performance Standards* that the **BoardFMB** has advised is being proposed for consideration by the **BoardFMB** in the financial performance review is based upon information provided by or on behalf of the **first nation** First Nation that is correct, is not misleading and does not omit any material information;
- a direction to and authorization of all councillors, officer and employees of the first nation Tirst Nation to cooperate, as required in these procedures, with the reviewer when conducting the review of the first nation's First Nation's financial performance;
- c. a direction to and authorization of the <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> auditor to communicate with the <u>BoardFMB</u> and to cooperate with the reviewer, as required in these procedures, when the <u>BoardFMB</u> is conducting the review of the <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial performance;
- d. an authorization to all contractors, agents or advisors of the <u>first nationFirst</u>
 <u>Nation</u> to provide information to the reviewer respecting the <u>first nation'sFirst</u>
 <u>Nation's</u> dealings with them as they relate to matters arising in the review of the <u>first nation'sFirst Nation's</u> financial performance;
- e. if the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> has local revenue laws made under the Act, an authorization to the officers and employees of the First Nations Tax Commission to provide to the reviewer any relevant information the Commission has with respect to the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u>;
- f. if the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> has a law or laws respecting financial administration for which the <u>BoardFMB</u> has issued a compliance approval under section 9 of the Act, a confirmation that the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u>
 - i. has not repealed its law or laws, and

- has not amended, or repealed and replaced, its law or laws without requesting the <u>BoardFMB</u> to review the amending or replacement law or laws and to issue a compliance approval under section 9 of the Act;
- g. if the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> has a Financial Management System Certificate issued by the <u>BoardFMB</u>, confirmation that the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> is in compliance with the *Financial Management Systems Standards*;
- h. if the <u>first_nationFirst_Nation</u> does not have a Financial Management System Certificate issued by the <u>BoardFMB</u> and intends to apply to become a borrowing member of the First Nations Finance Authority, a confirmation that the council of the <u>first_nationFirst_Nation</u> commits
 - to take all necessary actions to implement the <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial management system in accordance with the requirements of its law or laws respecting financial administration and the *Financial Management System Standards*, and
 - ii. to obtain a Financial Management System Certificate from the BoardFMB before the first nationFirst Nation passes a borrowing law for its second loan from the First Nations Finance Authority and, in any event, not later than 36 months from when the first nationFirst Nation receives proceeds for the first time from a debenture or equivalent financial instrument issued by the First Nations Finance Authority under the terms of a borrowing law and a security issuing council resolution;
- i. a confirmation and agreement that the first nationFirst Nation will indemnify, defend and hold harmless the BoardFMB, its directors, officers and employees and every person acting on behalf of or under the direction of the BoardFMB, its directors, officers and employees from any damages, costs, claims or causes of action arising from the conduct of any reviews under these procedures, from the reporting and consideration of the results of any reviews, from the giving of a report or an opinion respecting those reviews and from the issuance or revocation of a Financial Performance Certificate under these procedures unless these damages, costs, claims or causes of action result from gross negligence or bad faith;
- j. a confirmation that all information and documents provided to the BoardFMB in the request or to the reviewer under these procedures are correct as at the date the information or documents were provided, are not misleading in any respect and do not omit any material facts; and
- k. a confirmation that the resolution was approved at a duly called and conducted council meeting at which the required quorum of councillors was present

throughout and that the required number of councillors approved the resolution at the meeting.

6.3 Template forms – The recommended template forms for the resolution required in section 6.2 are on the <u>Board'sFMB's</u> website (<u>www.fnfmb.com</u>).

7.0 REVIEWER

- **7.1 Appointment** On receipt of all documents required by these procedures for a request for the formal review of a <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial performance, the <u>BoardFMB</u> will appoint a <u>person from its list of approved reviewers reviewer</u> and advise the <u>first nation First Nation</u> of the name and contact information of the reviewer.
- **7.2 Replacement of reviewer** The BoardFMB may replace the reviewer at any time.
- **7.3 Role of reviewer** A reviewer appointed by the <u>BoardFMB</u> has full authority to act for the <u>BoardFMB</u> in the conduct of a review of a <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial performance including the authority
 - a. to conduct a desk review of any documents supplied by the <u>first nationFirst</u>
 <u>Nation</u> under these procedures and any additional documents requested by the reviewer.
 - b. to conduct an on-site review at the offices of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> and any other location where the documents or records of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> are located or operations are conducted,
 - c. to communicate with any persons referred to in section 6.2-a--- e₇₋₄ and
 - d. to have access to and take copies of the first nation's First Nation's records.

7.4 Letter of authority — The Board will issue a letter of authority to the reviewer with a copy to the first nation stating the scope of the review to be performed and the anticipated time period during which it will be conducted.

8.0 FIRST NATION OBLIGATIONS

- **8.1 Required information** Before the reviewer appointed by the <u>BoardFMB</u> will begin the formal review of the <u>first nation'sFirst Nation's</u> financial performance, the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> is required to submit to the reviewer:
 - a. copies of documents that demonstrate that the provisions of the first nation's law or laws respecting financial administration referred to in standard 5.2 of the *Financial Performance Standards* have been implemented;
 - b.a. a copy of <u>annual</u> financial statements for each of the five most recent annual reporting periodsyears, together with a signed <u>independent auditor's</u> report

- for each of these reporting periods from an independent auditor<u>financial</u> statements; and
- <u>c.b.</u> any other information requested by the reviewer or the <u>BoardFMB</u> respecting matters relating to the <u>Board'sFMB's</u> formal review of the <u>first nation'sFirst Nation's</u> financial performance including, but not limited to, information respecting events subsequent to the most recent audited annual financial statements.
- **8.2 Cooperation** The council of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> is required to direct all councillors, officers, employees and auditors of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> to cooperate with the reviewer when carrying out a formal review of the <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial performance.
- **8.3 Nature of required cooperation** The obligation to cooperate referred to in section 8.2 includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - a. giving access to and providing copies of any records of the first nationFirst
 Nation that the reviewer requests in order to conduct the formal review;
 - giving access to all <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> offices and premises including those
 of any business operations under the control of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u>
 that the reviewer requests in order to conduct the formal review;
 - c. making persons referred to in section 8.2 available to meet with and answer questions of the reviewer in respect of the review; and
 - d. authorizing and requiring persons referred to in section 8.2 to confirm the correctness and completeness of all information and documentation provided by them from time to time during the course of the formal review including any normalization adjustment under Standard 8.0 of the Financial Performance Standards that the BoardFMB has advised it is considering.
- **8.4 Notice of failure to cooperate** If the <u>first nation</u> First Nation fails to cooperate with the reviewer as required in this section, the reviewer will give a detailed written notice to the <u>BoardFMB</u> with a copy to the <u>first nation</u> First Nation.
- **8.5** BoardFMB suspension of review After receipt of a notice from the reviewer under section 8.4, the BoardFMB may direct the reviewer to suspend the review until such time as the council of the first nationFirst Nation provides satisfactory assurances that the review may be conducted in accordance with these procedures.

9.0 FORMAL REVIEW AND REPORT TO BOARD FMB

9.1 Conduct – The reviewer will conduct the formal review of the <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial performance in accordance with the internal <u>Guidelines for the Conduct of the Review of</u>

Financial Performance <u>Certification Guidelines</u> established by the <u>BoardFMB</u> and as amended from time to time.

- **9.2 Report to** Board FMB The reviewer will deliver a report to the Board FMB setting out the reviewer's findings of the formal review.
- **9.3 Determination by the** BoardFMB The BoardFMB will consider the report of the reviewer and determine if, in its opinion, the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> was in compliance with *the Financial Performance Standards*.

10.0 MATERIAL ADVERSE DEVELOPMENT

10.1 Suspension of review – If, during the conduct of any stage of the formal review, the BoardFMB becomes aware of credible and material information relating to the economic circumstances or financial performance or management of the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u>, the <u>BoardFMB</u> may suspend its consideration of the <u>first nation'sFirst Nation's</u> request for a formal review of its financial performance until such time as the <u>BoardFMB</u> has had the opportunity to review such information with the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> and receive any clarification the <u>BoardFMB</u> requires.

10.2 Consideration of information – The BoardFMB may, at its discretion, refuse to issue a Financial Performance Certificate to a first nationFirst Nation that was otherwise in compliance with the Financial Performance Standards if there has been a material adverse development in the economic circumstances or the financial performance or management of the first nationFirst Nation since the issuance of the first nation's First Nation's most recent year-endannual audited financial statements.

11.0 REPORT TO FIRST NATION

- **11.1 Required report** After making its determination under section 9.3 the <u>BoardFMB</u> will provide the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> with a report required by <u>sectionsubsection</u> 50(2) of the Act setting out the following:
 - a. the scope of the formal review undertaken;
 - b. an opinion as to whether the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> was in compliance with the *Financial Performance Standards* or as to which aspects of the Standards were not being complied with by the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u>;
 - c. the Board's FMB's determination referred to in section 9.3;
 - d. if the <u>BoardFMB</u> is of the opinion that the <u>first_nationFirst_Nation</u> was in compliance with the *Financial Performance Standards*, any observations the <u>BoardFMB</u> may have with respect to any unique factors or circumstances which could affect the <u>first_nation'sFirst_Nation's</u> future compliance with the Standards; and

- e. if the <u>BoardFMB</u> is of the opinion that the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> was not in compliance with the *Financial Performance Standards*, any observations the <u>BoardFMB</u> may have respecting the extent of its non-compliance.
- 11.2 Request for meeting Within thirty (30) days after receipt of a report containing the information set out in section 11.1.e, the council of the first nationFirst Nation may request a representative of the BoardFMB to meet with the council.
- 11.3 Meeting within thirty (30) days After receipt of a request under section 11.2, the BoardFMB will appoint a representative to meet within thirty (30) days with the council of the first nationFirst Nation to discuss the report.

12.0 FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE CERTIFICATE

- 12.1 Certificate issued Subject to section 10.0, if, after completing the formal review of the first nation's First Nation's financial performance, the BoardFMB determines that the first nationFirst Nation was in compliance with the Financial Performance Standards, the BoardFMB will issue the first nationFirst Nation a Financial Performance Certificate under sectionsubsection 50(3) of the Act.
- **12.2 No certificate issued** If, after completing the formal review of a <u>first nation's First Nation's</u> financial performance, the <u>BoardFMB</u> determines that the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> was not in compliance with the *Financial Performance Standards*, the <u>BoardFMB</u> will not issue the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> a Financial Performance Certificate.
- **12.3 Copy to institutions** With consent or on request of the <u>first_nationFirst_Nation</u>, the <u>BoardFMB</u> will provide the First Nations Finance Authority and <u>/or</u> the First Nations Tax Commission with a true copy of a certificate issued under this section and a true copy of the report provided in section 11.1.

13.0 REVOCATION OF CERTIFICATE

- **13.1 Notice of intention to revoke** After giving reasonable written notice to the council of a first nationFirst Nation, the BoardFMB may revoke a Financial Performance Certificate issued to the first nationFirst Nation if, on the basis of financial or other information available to the BoardFMB, it is of the opinion that grounds set out in subsection 50(4) of the Act for revoking a certificate exist.
- 13.2 Contents of notice The notice in section 13.1 must
 - a. include the financial or other information available to the BoardFMB on which it intends to make its decision to revoke the Financial Performance Certificate, and
 - b. give the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> a reasonable opportunity to respond before the <u>BoardFMB</u> makes its decision.

- **13.3 Notice of decision** The BoardFMB will give written notice of its decision to revoke a Financial Performance Certificate to
 - a. the council of the first nationFirst Nation,
 - b. the First Nations Finance Authority, and
 - c. the First Nations Tax Commission.
- **13.4 Required remediation** If the <u>BoardFMB</u> revokes the Financial Performance Certificate of a <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> that is a borrowing member of the First Nations Finance Authority, the <u>first nationFirst Nation</u> must, without delay, take any measures required to re-establish its certification.



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
